

# **Key Messages from the Winter 2022 Section of Residents Council (SoR) Meeting**

### **Update on Guide for Improvement of Family Medicine Training (GIFT) Tools**

The 2021 GIFT on the medical use of cannabis is nearing completion. A one-pager outlining recommendations for curriculum improvements will be released in the coming months.

The selected 2022 GIFT topic is obesity management. Working group members have conducted an environmental scan and developed a survey that will be sent to residents and program directors in the spring to help narrow the focus of this project. Please look out for this survey as your feedback is invaluable. Analysis of the data will be undertaken over the summer and a draft one-pager with recommendations will be presented to program directors requesting their feedback in November.

- Resident Challenges: Pandemic/less exposure to certain cases/less ability to build cohesiveness
  with resident cohort; workflow/wellness/burnout; importance of adapting to communities that
  residents are training in.
- Outcomes of Training Project Final Report/ Recommendations (English/ French): The project offers a critical reflection on the current training of family physicians in dynamically changing times. Other important documents: Family Medicine Professional Profile (FMPP) and the Residency Training Profile.
- What a potential third year of training would look like: This is still to be determined. An education taskforce will be struck to look at this.

#### **New Pilot**

A national mentorship program — Residents' Corner — was being developed last year to help connect and support family medicine residents in Canada. Building on that discussion, this year's SoR members suggested the creation of a regular (i.e., quarterly or monthly) blog in Canadian Family Physician (CFP), covering a range of topics important to family medicine residents nationally (e.g., anti-racism, planetary health, virtual care, wellness, etc.). The program will provide ongoing opportunities for resident collaboration and generate scholarship and leadership opportunities. Stay tuned for more information on how you can contribute and get involved.

### **Hybrid FMF 2022**

This year's FMF will be held in-person in Toronto from November 9th to 12th and virtually from November 16th to 19th. The intention is for these to be two individual experiences and not mirror images of one another. FMF 2022 will include interactive breakout sessions for participants, social events, and various networking opportunities. The call for free-standing papers and posters along with the call for Big Ideas Soapbox is now open.

## **Practice Management Prep**

Don't forget to check out <u>Practice Management Prep</u> (PM Prep). This is an online tool for residents that includes self-reflection exercises, learning plans, and a repository of practice management resources intended to support family physicians in their transition from residency to independent practice. The business side of practice, or practice management, is an area in which new family doctors have requested additional learning opportunities.
