The College of Family Physicians of Canada (CFPC) would like to commend you for introducing Motion M-456, *a Pan- Canadian Palliative and End –of-life Care Strategy*.

The CFPC supports Motion M-456 and believes it is a necessary and cost-effective step towards improving end-of-life and palliative care of Canadians. In October 2010, the CFPC presented the family physician perspective on palliative care to the Parliamentary Committee on Palliative and Compassionate Care and advocated the position in your motion.
