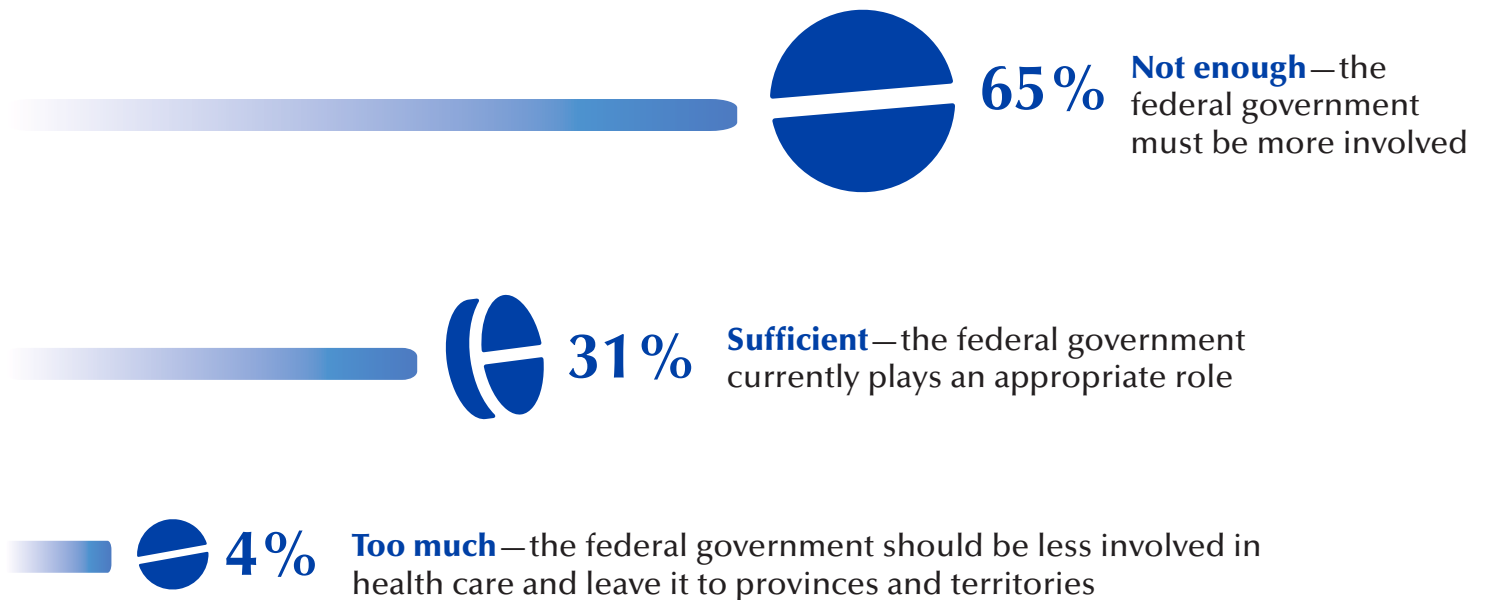
### Member Statistics

Q1. What is your assessment of the role that the federal government currently plays in health care?

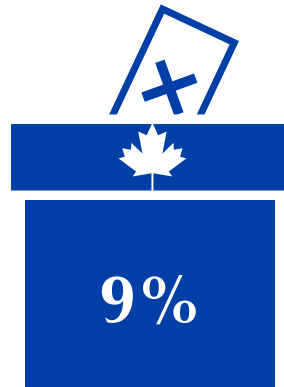




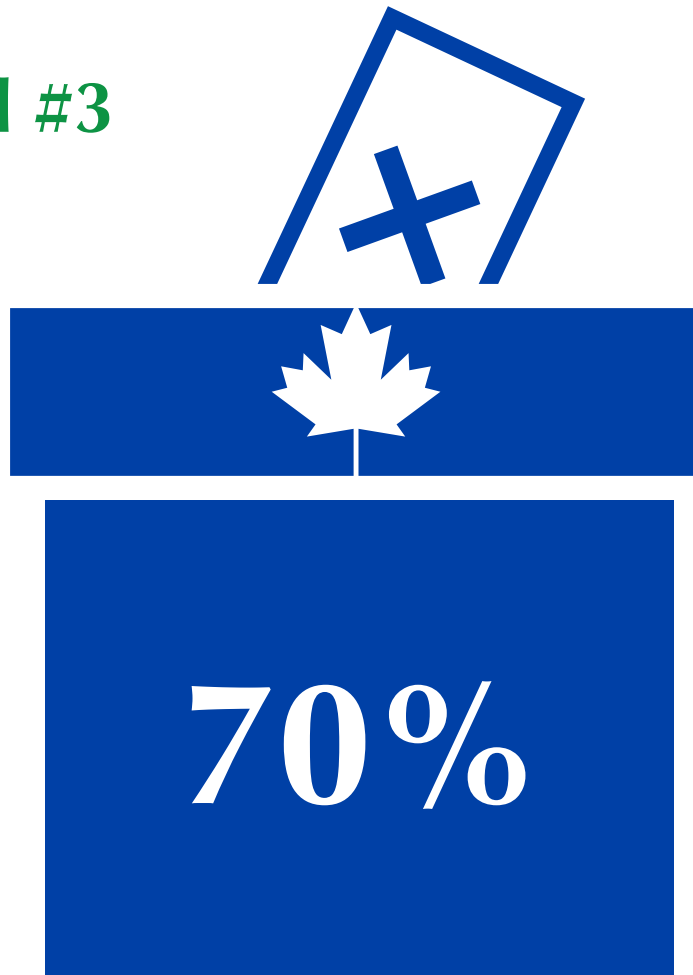

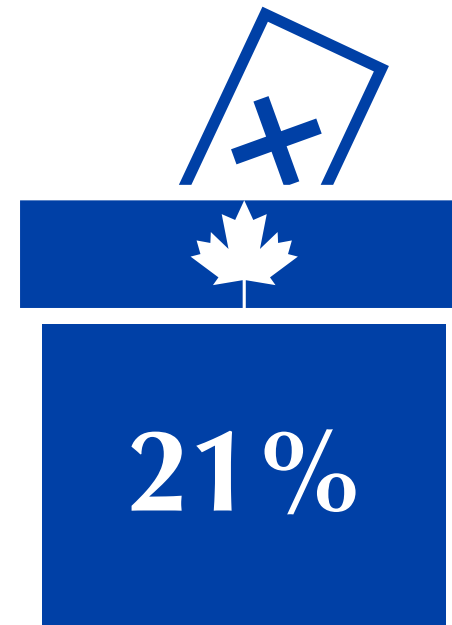
Q2. In your opinion, where should health care stand as an election issue?



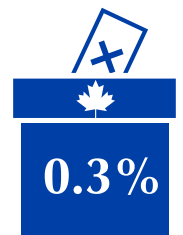
The number one issue facing Canada and Canadians

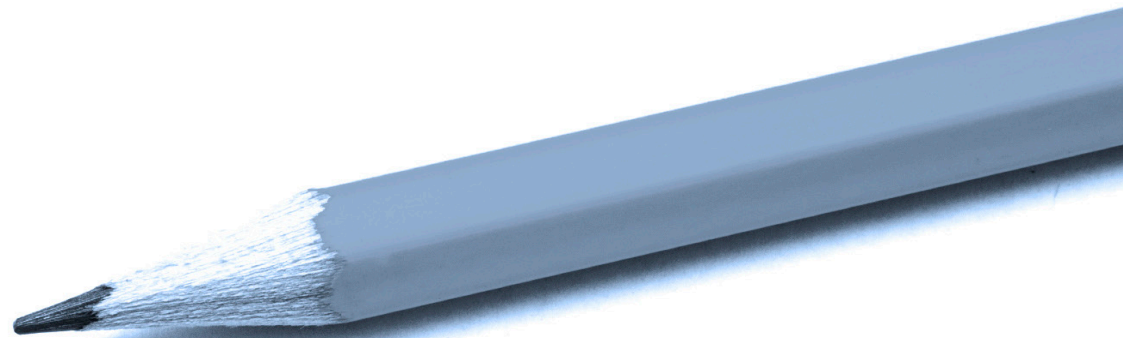
